From time to time parents are faced with the daunting prospect of being late to pick up their child from school. A car has broken down or there is a traffic accident can be a stressful situation. In cases such as this we completely understand and we will ensure your child is safe whilst you are on the way. Please ensure you contact the school to let us know of your situation. Parents must be aware that the front office is not a child minding facility, if it is not an emergency. The front office closes at 3.00pm. Parents must not tell their child to go to the front office and wait for them, then beep the horn from the street waiting for their child to come to the car.

Students must also not be expected to wait in the school grounds unsupervised waiting for parents. Parents must make arrangements to pick up their child as soon as school finishes or enquire with Metella Road OOSH about after school vacancies.

I am aware that in any situation that involves our children as parents our emotions can become very heightened. This does not give any parent the right to speak to our office staff in an aggressive and offensive manner. We all want the best for the students at Metella Road PS, parents and staff alike.

Although we are into Term 4 and the end of the year is in sight I would like to remind all of our students and parents of the importance of wearing our school uniform.

Children who wear a school uniform are displaying pride in their school. They feel that they belong to the school and it belongs to them. The development of self-pride and team spirit is an important part of leading young people towards becoming responsible adult citizens.

Deputy Principal's Report

I cannot believe that it is already Term 4 Week 4! Where has the year gone? During morning assemblies last week, I paid particular attention to our Kindergarten students who have almost finished their first year of schooling; and our Year 6 students who will soon complete their last year in primary school. It's amazing to see how the students have grown and developed their potential over the last three terms. This term has already seen a number of highly successful events including Multicultural Day, the Year 6 Mini-Fete, the NSWPSA Girls Football final, the Kindergarten (2017) Parent Information Evening and the Father/Child football match. Our school was also showcased in the *PBL Teach Meet* that saw a large number of schools attend Metella Road Public School to share ideas about Positive Behaviour for Learning. Thank you to all of our staff and school community, without whom, these events would not be possible.

This term Year 5 students who would like to apply for a position at a selective high school in 2018 will undergo school-based, standardised testing to assist with the determination of their school assessment score. Metella Road Public School is required to score and rank students in both English and mathematics, and this information is then submitted to the High Performing Students Unit. Please be aware that the school

assessment scores will be scaled (moderated) according to the performance of Metella Road Public School students in the Selective High School Placement test (which takes place on March 9 2017). This allows for our school assessment scores to be compared with the school assessment scores of all other applicants in NSW and gives them equal weighting with the English and mathematics test scores.

Again this term, we are focusing on attendance. Compulsory school attendance is essential for your child to achieve their educational potential. When children attend school every day, learning becomes easier and children build and maintain friendships with their peers. On occasion, your child may be absent from school and justified reasons for absences include:

- Being sick or having an infectious disease
- Having an unavoidable medical appointment
- Being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- Exceptional or urgent family circumstances (such as attending a funeral).

Following an absence from school, you must ensure that you provide within 7 days either a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, please be aware that if you have not provided an explanation within 2 days, you may be contacted to discuss the absence.

Lost property has become increasingly problematic over the last term. Each week we are discarding a very large number of unclaimed lunch boxes and drink bottles, as well as donating unlabelled clothing items to Stewart House. Items with students' names are always returned to the student. Please make sure that all items are clearly labelled and have a chat with your children about ensuring they look after their belongings at school.

Finally, please make sure that you check Facebook, the Metella Road Public School app and our website to keep up-to-date.

Stage 1 News

Term 4 has begun with students showing a positive and motivated attitude to learning. They have come back from holidays with a renewed drive to learn as much as they can. Students thoroughly enjoyed participating in Multicultural Day, immersing themselves in the culture of other countries. Many of our students experienced different dances, created beautiful artworks and learnt about different languages. They tasted delicious food from different countries and enjoyed describing the diverse taste sensations. Our Stage 1 students also loved participating in Mini-Fete. A great day was had by all – so much so, that many students expressed their desire to have Mini-Fete every day!

We look forward to the coming weeks of Term 4. In Science, students are learning about forces – push and pull. They are examining toys that they can push and pull, aiming to be able to determine why some objects can be pushed and pulled. In Human Society and its Environment (HSIE), students are learning about various community groups that exist in their community. We have been researching what makes a community group and why they are so important. This subject is complemented well in our English programs, where our students are focusing on the theme “Communities”, particularly examining the different perspectives that the author presents. Students have been learning how to write like acclaimed authors and how to craft their descriptions so that their readers are able to visualise images in their heads. It is exciting to watch our students weave similes and metaphors into their writing so that their work leaps off the page!

In Mathematics, students have been developing multiple strategies of how to partition numbers into 100s, 10s and 1s to become super quick mathematicians. Many investigations have been undertaken in our classes to examine the mass of various objects. Year 1 students had to investigate the mass of their lunchbox contents! We found out that many students come to school very well stocked and very well fed! Our students are also learning how to use multiple strategies to add and subtract. We learnt that using different strategies helps us to add quickly and more efficiently.

Our Stage 1 teachers are beginning to write this semester's reports and we look forward to sharing the progress of our students with you. It has been an exciting year to watch our students develop into life-long learners; continually absorbing, critically analysing and applying new-found knowledge! Stage 1 is an exciting place to be at this time of year!

Stage 2 News

The students in Stage 2 have come back from holiday feeling motivated and ready to "Aim High" in their learning for their last term. We have already started Term 4 with some amazing opportunities and events with Multicultural Day and the Year 6 Mini-Fete.

The first focus for the term is Respect; particularly focussing on active listening by: 1) Eye contact. 2) Close your lips when someone is speaking. 3) Think about what the person is saying. 4) Wait your turn. 5) Positive language. Starting week 3 the focus for the fortnight is: Be proud- Wear correct school uniform. Teachers will be rewarding those students who wear their full school uniform every day.

The students are learning about our school expectations through the fortnightly movie that Mr Byrnes produces. The students are encouraged to display these behaviours and are rewarded when doing so with Mini Metella's by the teachers.

This term in modelled reading, we are learning all about quality texts that convey messages about cultural diversity. The students will be engaging in reading, writing and discussion about celebrations and commemorations in Australia and around the world. We will be focusing on shared texts that represent different countries with a focus on meaning and comprehension. We are continuing to include our "Super Six" strategies to assist in deeper connections and understandings with each text.

In mathematics the students have been learning various whole number and addition and subtraction strategies. In the strand of measurement, we are learning all about the different concepts of time and mass. The students have been enjoying lots of hands on activities to achieve these outcomes.

During science and technology the students are learning smooth moves or day and night. In HSIE the topic is cooperating communities. For PD/H/PE the students are focussing on drug education and safe living.

Library News

The library has been reviewing, culling and cleaning the non-fiction section at present. There will be no stocktake this year owing to the changeover to Oliver (our new computer system), however books are still due back by the end of Week 7 as there is no borrowing over the Christmas vacation and borrowing ceases Week 8 this year.

For your information students are able to reserve books through their portal. Stage 2 and 3 students have been shown how to do this, but this does not mean they should not look for the book as well, as I only see the reservation when the item is attempted to be borrowed by someone else. It is at that point I can put it aside. Reservations only stay on the system for a few weeks so you may need to renew it regularly until you receive the item.

Stage 1 has been learning about listening to multicultural stories, while learning to use key words to label water creatures. It is important that students be able to identify key words so research can begin. Year 2 will be introduced to the research steps by the end of the term.

Stage 2 has been listening to multicultural stories that are old and recent. They have been learning to identify key issues that arise from these stories and note them as key words in order to write their own sentences about the aspect covered.

Stage 3 has been listening to ancient stories that are from other lands, as well as researching another country for geography, people, lifestyle and cultural aspects.

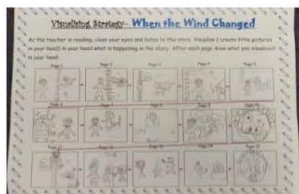
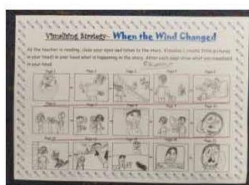


3/4B CLASS REPORT

3/4B has come back from holidays refreshed and ready to learn all they can before the end of the year.

They have all come back excited and motivated and ready to share their experiences of their holiday recounts.

We are continuing to focus on quality texts focusing on Cultural Diversity. Through our "Knee to knee" strategy and our discussion circles we are looking at the purpose, audience, stereotypes and objective / subjective viewpoints as well as visual literacy. We are reading in class "The Silence Seeker". They are using the skills of a 21st century learner including, communication, collaboration and critical thinking. 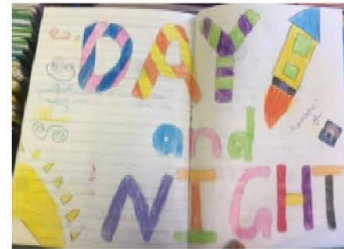
4W CLASS REPORT
