Deputy Principal's Report

It's been flying start to the school term with Athletics Carnival, Education Week Open Day and the upcoming author visit with Aaron Blabey, the Book Fair and Book Week celebrations. Stage 3 have their Snowy Mountains and Canberra camp to look forward to and the P&C are holding their major fundraiser for the year, an open air movie night on 10 September on the school oval.

A big focus for our students this term is getting to school on time. Getting to school before the bell is important because it gives students the opportunity to interact with their friends on the playground. It also ensures that students don't miss important morning assemblies and messages that are communicated through Sentral every morning. For some students, being late often makes the transition into class difficult as they can feel anxious and rushed. So far this term, we have seen less late arrivals and this is having a positive impact in classrooms.

On July 1 the first stage of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (commonly referred to as the NDIS) began to roll out in NSW. The NDIS is an Australian wide scheme that replaces the current NSW disability support system. In Western Sydney, this rollout included the local government areas of Auburn, Blacktown, Holroyd, Parramatta and The Hills Shire. The NDIS will provide targeted, individualised support and improved access to services for people living with disabilities. Eligible participants are provided with a funding package that allows them to choose the services and help they need, in the way they want.

The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) has been established by the Australian Government to implement the Scheme. The role of the NDIA is to work with eligible families to develop a plan to support their needs and help them to achieve their goals. The plan is then is used to provide a funding package under the NDIS. The level of funding is directly related to the persons' needs. If you have a child with a disability and believe that you may be eligible for the NDIS, please visit the website below to check your child's eligibility using the NDIS Access Checklist. You are also welcome to contact myself if you would like assistance to better understand the process.

Kindergarten News

Congratulations to the Kindergarten students for a great start to Term 3. It is wonderful to see the students working hard and being motivated learners.

This term the students in Kindergarten will be learning about the importance of farms and farm animals. We have been discussing and writing about farm animals including what they look like, what they eat, where they live and what they give us. This week we have the privilege of having the *Living Eggs Hatching Program* in our classrooms. This program enables the students to develop a deeper understanding of the life cycle of a chicken. The students were able to witness chicks actually hatching from their eggs and observe them growing and changing. The students have thoroughly enjoyed this heart-warming experience. We are looking forward to seeing other farm animals and learning more about farm life, when we visit Calmsley Hill City Farm later this term.

We are also studying the author Mem Fox and reading lots of her books. We are learning about the characters in the stories and comparing them to ourselves and other characters. During our Science lessons, the students are investigating different types of weather, and talking about how the weather can affect what we do and what we wear. In Mathematics, we have been learning to count forwards and backwards from a given number and add and subtract groups. We have also identified and sorted two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects.

Last week we had our Education Week Open Day where the parents visited the Kindergarten classrooms and had the opportunity to look at the wonderful work we have completed throughout the year. The students were very proud of what they have achieved and enjoyed sharing their learning with their family and friends.

We are looking forward to more fun and exciting events happening this term, including our Book Week author visit, the Book Character Parade and our excursion to Calmsley Hill City Farm.

Stage 1 News

We cannot believe that it is already Term 3! Our Stage 1 students have immersed themselves again in their learning, showing that they are motivated learners! They enjoyed having their parents and grandparents visit their classroom last week for Education Week. It was wonderful to see so many parents come and see the amazing work their children have done throughout the year. We also enjoyed watching the many performances at our Open Day Assembly – they were most entertaining!

In English, students have been exploring the theme of heroes. They have been investigating the characteristics of a hero and the different ways people can be heroes. We are reading a wide selection of texts that feature heroes of different shapes and sizes, learning how to compare and contrast the multiple characteristics of heroes. Students have been learning about onomatopoeia (BOOM! CRASH! POW!) and have been having an exciting time creating their own comic strips featuring their heroes and villains. We have been focusing on the verbs that are used to explain the action of the superheroes and have been even learning how adverbs describe the verb! In Writing, students have been learning how to "show", rather than just tell to make their writing interesting and easy to visualise. We are so proud of their efforts this term!

In Mathematics, students have been learning how to make groups of 10 to help them count quickly. They are developing more sophisticated strategies to help them add and subtract numbers more quickly and effectively. Students are using strategies such as 'doubles' and 'near doubles'. They are very clever! We have also been investigating the properties of twodimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects. Students have been integrating technology with Mathematics to produce two-dimensional shaped houses.

In Science, our Stage 1 students have been learning all about water. They have been investigating the water cycle, determining where water actually comes from. They have been mad magicians, creating evaporation, condensation and precipitation ... IN A BAG!! Can you believe it?! Students have been observing a cloud in a bag and then watching it rain! They have also been conducting very serious investigations to determine if it matters how much water plants receive. They





have made lots of hypotheses and we cannot wait to see if our predictions were correct!

In Human Society and Its Environment, students have been learning about our waterways (which ties in beautifully with our Science unit) and why it is important to keep them clean. Students are thoroughly enjoying learning how to be responsible citizens who care for our waterways. They definitely see the value in responsibly using water as students have come to the conclusion that we desperately need water to survive!

Stage 1 students have been focusing on keeping their hands and feet to themselves over the past fortnight. They are reminded every morning at our morning assembly the importance of being kind. Students know that if they require any help on the playground, they can always ask a teacher for assistance. We believe that all our students deserve to feel safe and happy at school.

We are incredibly proud of our Stage 1 students and commend them for their motivation. Our students continually Aim High! Well done Year 1 and Year 2!

The students in Stage Two have made a great start to the term. This fortnight's focus is Motivation. The students are demonstrating that they are in lines on time. Students that are showing this are receiving Mini Metella's, which is a new initiative system that has been put in place by our PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) team, to promote this focus.

Last term, Stage 2 went on our excursion to The Power House Museum, Observatory Hill and a tour around the Rocks. We all had such a wonderful day! We had the experience of experimenting in the Discovery room, which the students were amazed by. The students also got to observe how technology, engineering, science and design have impacted Australia and the world. We enjoyed a picnic lunch on Observatory Hill and experienced the Rocks with our walking tour. The students discovered many old buildings and brick work that the convicts had made as well as some of our famous icons. Thanks to all those parents who came and helped with our classes. Miss Diamond and Miss Erdelj did a fantastic job organising, which was appreciated by all.

This term in Modelled Reading, we are learning all about quality texts with highly complex messeges. Through a variety of shared experiences including: reading, writing, speaking and listening activities, our students are investigating and analysing effective techniques used by authors to engage readers. Through these investigations they are composing their own imaginative texts such as descriptions and narratives that have language focuses. These consist of complex sentences, quoted speech, noun groups, adjectives, idioms and apostrophes. It has been sensational to observe them discuss and construct their own complex narratives and descriptions.

In Mathematics the students have been learning various whole number and addition and subtraction strategies. In the strand of space, we are learning all about the different concepts of two dimensional shapes, including symmetry, regular and irregular and rigidity of shapes and tessellation. Thank you to all those parents who took the time out of their day to come and visit our classrooms during Open Day.
